#### From the Pastors Desk.....

Lent is upon us. My challenge to you remains - to worship with the congregation at least once a week for these five weeks of Lent. The basic practices of Lent besides worship are fasting, prayer and giving to the poor. I encourage you to do these as well. Give something up for Lent and use your desire for that thing as a prompt to pray. Give money to the poor. You can donate to the PERF fund at church - that is the Pastor's Emergency Relief Fund. Or give to one of our great Lutheran charities that serve the poor and have very low percentage of administrative costs like Lutheran World Relief, www.lwr.org. You might want to give the money you saved not purchasing the thing you gave up for Lent to the poor. There are also great local agencies like Ada Jenkins and Urban Ministries that are worthy of our financial support.

On Wednesdays I'll be preaching on themes presented to the ELCA by our presiding Bishop, Elizabeth Eaton. She reminds us that we are Church, Lutheran, Church Together and Church for the Sake of the World. I'm excited to dive into these topics. Here's my first thoughts.

We are Church- Sometimes I feel more like a cruise ship director than a pastor. I can get caught up in directing programs and focusing on facilities more than I should. I need to remember that first and foremost we are the church. We are a people claimed by God in Jesus and called to worship God. We are to be centered on the worship and proclamation of Jesus. All of our programs and efforts at Community in Christ ought to be evaluated through that lens.

We are Lutheran- We have a distinct understanding of the Christian faith. We preach the gospel of salvation by Grace through faith. We administer the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion. We read the Bible looking for Jesus and letting Him be our interpretive guide.

We are church together-We aren't just CIC, but rather partners with many other congregations across the state, nation and world. this is why we send some of our offerings away to the Synod which sends a great deal to the ELCA both return a great deal of that money to congregations across the state and nation and sends some on to agencies around the world. All of this because we can accomplish more together than we can by ourselves.

We are church for the sake of the world- Our goal is to bless others. To work for justice in the world. To alleviate suffering, to feed the hungry, to clothe the naked, to heal the sick. We aren't working to bless ourselves or fill our corporate bank accounts. We are working so that the least among us can be blessed through us.

I hope you'll join us on Wednesday nights as we explore some of these concepts in greater detail. On Sundays in Lent we'll be working through the parables of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew, and I'm excited about that as well

May God bless our Lenten journey and bring us all to the great joy of the Easter celebration!

#### **Lay Ministry Training April 14, 2015**


If you are interested in visiting sick members and shut-ins, sending cards to members and their loved ones, preparing an




#### **Prayer Shawl Ministry**

#### Music News

On March 25 as part of our last Wednesday Lenten Service we will be presenting "The Living Last Supper," a dramatization of the mural painting by Leonardo da Vinci. I would like to share some interesting facts about this famous artwork as noted in the Encyclopedia of Art Education. "Created between 1495 to 1498, this painting illustrates the scene from the last days of Jesus Christ, as described in the Gospel of John 13:21. Flanked by his twelve apostles, Jesus has just declared that one of them will betray him. ('Verily I say unto you: one of you will betray me.') The picture depicts the reaction of each disciple to the news. Although on the surface it looks like a straightforward piece of Biblical art, it is in fact an exceptionally complex work, whose mathematical symbolism, psychological complexity, use of perspective and dramatic focus, make it the first real example of High Renaissance art. The picture measures 15 feet × 29 ft, and occupies an end wall in the dining hall at the convent of Santa Maria delle Grazie in Milan. Sadly, in order to give himself the opportunity of making changes to the painting as he went along - something that is not possible with regular wet fresco painting - Leonardo first sealed the stone wall surface and then painted over it with tempera and oils, as if it were a wooden panel. As a result, the work began deteriorating almost from the moment it was finished and has been the subject of a recent 20-year restoration campaign.

"Jesus himself is the dynamic center of the composition. Several architectural features converge on his figure, while his head represents the vanishing point for all perspective lines - an event which makes The Last Supper the epitome of Renaissance single point linear perspective. Meantime, his expansive gesture - indicating the holy sacrament of bread and wine - is not meant for his apostles, but for the monks and nuns of the Santa Maria delle Grazie monastery.

"In most paintings of The Last Supper, Judas is the only disciple not to have a halo, or else is seated separately from the other apostles. Leonardo, however, seats everyone on the same side of the table, so that all are facing the viewer. Even so, Judas remains a marked man. First, he is grasping a small bag, no doubt symbolizing the 30 pieces of silver he has been paid to betray Jesus; he has also knocked over the salt pot - another symbol of betrayal. His head is also positioned in a lower position than anyone in the picture, and is the only person left in shadow."

Finally, "The painting contains a number of allusions to the number 3, (perhaps symbolizing the Holy Trinity). The disciples are seated in groups of three; there are three windows, while the figure of Jesus is given a triangular shape, marked by his head and two outstretched arms."

Our dramatization of this artwork will try to bring to life those last moments when the disciples of Jesus begin to question what is about to take place in the life of their Savior May this production offer you a special moment of reflection during this time of Lent.

#### **Altar Flowers Ministry**



March 2015 marks a very special milestone for the Altar Flowers Ministry. It was four years ago in 2011 that Anna Roth established the ministry in response to the Forward in Faith Capital Building Campaign. Since then Anna has been sharing her artistic talents with us by creating the beautiful floral arrangements placed by the altar, and at the same time she has helped to build our new sanctuary. Additionally, as part of the ministry, Anna takes charge of ordering, purchasing and displaying the Christmas poinsettias and Easter lilies. She also, upon request, has prepared floral arrangements for CIC special events whether in the sanctuary or in the fellowship hall.

As a result of Anna's hard work and dedication to the Altar Flowers Ministry, she has raised a tidy sum of money for the building fund. Thank you, Anna! We appreciate your time, talent and your devoted discipleship. Of course, this would not have been possible without the generous support of many CIC members who over the past four years have faithfully sponsored and paid for flowers to be placed by the altar including poinsettias and lilies. Anna thanks you as well as the individuals who so generously have donated flowers from their own gardens. Anna is extremely grateful for all of your support. Together we thank God for guiding and blessing this ministry.

Now for some current information. On several recent Sundays, you may have noticed that floral arrangements were not on display in the sanctuary. Instead, the Peace Lily plants, purchased by Anna and normally on the welcome desk in the narthex, were placed in the sanctuary on the floral stands. This brought forward the question, "Where are the floral arrangements?" The answer is, if no one signs up to sponsor the flowers for that Sunday, there are no floral arrangements on display. There will always be flowers on display when someone has committed to being a sponsor, and the sponsorship is noted in the worship bulletin for that particular Sunday.

If you are a sponsor, the arrangements are yours to take with you after the 11:00 a.m. service, or you may choose to keep them in the sanctuary for weekday services or events. If that is the case, Anna adds additional water on Tuesday morning to keep the flowers fresh. If you take the flowers with you on Sunday or early in the week, Anna requests that you please return the plastic insert cup holders to the church office. The reason being, it is difficult to find plastic inserts that fit inside the vases.

If you are a sponsor and have a specific floral request, please contact Anna and she will do her best to accommodate your request. Also for our new members, the 2015 Altar Flowers Calendar is located on the ministry's bulletin board in the fellowship hall. It is hanging on the wall next to the library bookshelves. Each Sunday is represented on the calendar. Sign your name on your special date if it is still available and indicate if the flowers are in memory of loved ones or to celebrate a special occasion. Write your check payable to "CIC" for \$40.00 with "Altar Flowers" in the memo. You may give your check to Stephanie Wheeler in the church office or place it in the offering plate. 
#### <u>Vision Checkups Rescheduled</u>


