Agapé Day Camp Protocols 2021

Because we hold the safety of all as a major goal we practice the highest standards we can adhere to. The following protocol for Agapé Day Camp 2021 are part of that practice. They are subject to change as we prepare for Day Camp in 2021. Agreement to uphold these protocols by all involved is essential to ensure a safe and fun partnership in offering a week of Day Camp.

Key Words:

- Cohort = Cabin Group of one counselor and eight campers.
- Community = Entire Day Camp group.

General Protocols:

- Adherence to all local and state Health Department guidelines, CDC guidance, and American Camp Association best practices.
- CDC- approved face coverings (no bandanas or gaiters) must be worn by all campers, staff, volunteers, church staff that may encounter Day Campers, and parents.
 - We will work with staff to find times in daily schedules to be socially distanced outside so that face coverings can be removed.
- Agapé leadership staff with assistance from the Day Camp Site Coordinator will complete daily temperature and health screenings for all campers and volunteers working with the Day Camp program.

Agapé † Kure Beach Ministries Staff Will:

- Maintain social distancing in community settings between cohorts.
 - Assigned seating at Daily Opening and Closing
 - Use color-coordinated poly dots as markers for campers to keep a minimum of 6 feet of distance
- Assign campers in cohorts with a ratio of one staff for eight campers
- Plan for and initiate increased frequency of hand washing and use of hand sanitizer.
- Increase cleaning/disinfecting commonly touched surfaces, shared supplies, and daily cleaning of all spaces they use.
- Complete temperature and health screening for each other before the day begins.
- Pack their lunches before the day begins.
- A†KB will attempt to ensure all of our staff are vaccinated against COVID-19 if available.

<u>Pre-arrival Protocols:</u>

- If anyone in a camper or volunteer household has been exposed to COVID-19 in the two weeks before the scheduled week of Day Camp or is displaying symptoms such as Fever (100.4* Fahrenheit or higher), dry cough, shortness of breath, chills, fatigue, loss of sense of taste and/or smell, or headache please do not come to Day Camp.
- All parents will need to agree to these protocols and sign a COVID-19 waiver in order for their child(ren) to participate in Agapé Day Camp.

Drop-off and Pick-up Protocol:

- Sites will need to develop a drop-off and pick-up schedule that works for their site maintaining social distancing (preferably outside).
- Anyone involved in the Day Camp program will have their temperature taken and have a brief health screening upon arrival

Parents must wait until their child is cleared before leaving

Ongoing Protocols:

- Programming will be modified to enhance social distancing
 - Daily opening and closing will be in a space large enough to separate the community group through social distancing (preferably outside).
 - Games and activities played in the community group will be played outside or in a large indoor space and changed to minimize contact and enhance distancing.
 - Assign, when possible, each cabin group a room where they can do daily activities instead of general program areas
 - ie- "Mark's Cabin will be in the 4th grade Sunday School Room this week" for craft, Bible study, story, snack etc for the week instead of separate rooms (will minimize disinfectant frequency and shared supplies).
 - Unfortunately we will be unable to offer Sunday evening Meet and Greet Program or Closing Parent Programs in 2021.
- All camper lunches must be packed and brought from home
- Daily snack must be a manufacturer packaged item (ie-fruit cup or chip variety packs)
 - O No separating snack into bowls, cups, plates, baggies etc.
 - Snack should either be delivered to each cabin group or campers must be able to grab their own snack. Please do not have volunteers serving snack.
