From the Pastors.....

So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith. Galatians 6:9-10

Do you have a junk sleep problem? Recently, one of the national mattress chains released a clever ad campaign asking that very question. To illustrate what "junk sleep" is they reference various things that people do when they are tired: misplace items, forget important details, mix up various memories...if you have not seen the commercials, they are quite humorous.

A good mattress and a quality night's sleep can go a long way in helping us avoid the negative effects of "junk sleep." But, there are a lot of other reasons as to why we might be feeling exhausted at this point in time. The last 18 months have been incredibly hard on everyone. And, as we have heard from other colleagues and mental health professionals, this current stretch we are in might just be the most difficult period thus far.

How then can we not "grow weary" in doing what is right as Paul said in his letter to the Galatians? The best mattress in the world cannot alleviate the stressors and unknowns that we carry. How do we not lose heart when so many people are blatantly flippant about the reality of the virus, how do we not lose heart when we see crisis and death happening in Afghanistan, how can we not lose heart when areas are repeatedly hit by hurricanes, how do we not lose heart when bomb threats are made during the first week of school, how do we not lose heart when we witness parents berate school board members who instill policies recommended by health professionals, how do we not lose heart when each day more and more stories are shared of doctors and nurses resigning because of burnout?

The situation we find ourselves in is exhausting! There is no way around it. And yet, Paul's words still ring in our ears. "Do not grow weary in doing what is right..." Paul shares the why we shouldn't grow weary. Paul's rationale is because he doesn't want us to miss the harvest time. Because, if we are "doing what is good", we are planting seeds of hope, forgiveness, compassion, justice, grace, and love. And, in time, those seeds will eventually grow and bloom...an experience that is too good to miss. That is why Paul says we shouldn't stop doing the very things God has instructed us to do.

But the question of "how" still remains. How do we not grow weary? Jesus has an answer to that pondering. Jesus tells us to come to him. That whenever we are feeling weary and are carrying burdens that are just too much, that we are to come to him. In worship. In prayer. In water, bread, wine. In fellowship. In service. Jesus is present in all of these things offering to us his love and grace, which fuel us to do the good we do in this life.

A new mattress might do wonders for your junk sleep. The kind of weariness we are enduring though, we need something far more powerful than that. Lucky for us, we know where we can access the love and grace that is crucial for us to keep going. And, inevitably, when we begin to lose heart, when the weariness does set in, Jesus is still present and ready to give us the rest we need to continue doing the good we are called to do. Let us make sure we utilize the opportunities God gives us for rest and renewal.


