



From the Pastors.....

Dear Community in Christ,

"For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." Matthew 18:20

How? & When? These are the questions that have been consuming much of our time and energy over the month of May. When will we be able to physically gather together again? How will we be able to physically gather together when the time comes? Some days, the information surrounding our questions would arrive to us like a slow trickle. Other days, it hit like a tsunami. In consideration to these questions, there are recommendations from medical professionals like the Centers for Disease Control that go along with local and state regulations that churchwide and denominational leaders then try to morph into practices for individual congregations. There are many, many factors and layers that go into answering our questions. And, these factors and layers are changing—frequently.

As of May 22nd, North Carolina entered into "Safer At Home—Phase 2." This states that indoor gatherings are still limited to 10 people or less. Phase 2 is currently scheduled to last until June 26th, however, it could be extended or shortened. These recommendations are based on our state's infection data and how we delay or prevent infecting one another for both the love of each other and the healthcare system taking care of all of our needs. Given this timeframe, we are anticipating that our most common method for worship during the month of June will continue to be virtual.

Conversation about *how* and *when is* occurring among congregational leadership and the plan is adjusting as new information is provided to us. *How* it will look will be significantly different than any of us have ever experienced. On the short list: numbers will be limited; seats will be separated; live singing and corporate speaking will not take place; communion, passing of the peace, and offering will not involve contact; and there will be nothing that can be touched like hymnals or bulletins. But, at the point *when* the timing is right and solidified for our in-person gatherings, we will be ready.

Central to the answers of our *how* and *when* questions is the element of <u>safety</u>. A popular phrase circulating among church and business leadership recently goes along the lines of, "Just because we can doesn't mean we should." Undoubtedly, you have heard elected officials encouraging churches to open. We are immensely grateful for our religious freedoms and our ability to be a worshiping community, however, the *right* to gather at this time does not mean it is wise for us to do so. This virus, unfortunately, can't tell if we're sitting in a school classroom, restaurant, movie theater, or church. It just wants to keep finding new bodies to find a home. The health and well-being of the congregation and our community will always be of the utmost concern for any future decisions congregational leadership make moving towards in-person gatherings, and those decisions will be based on the recommendations of public health, infectious disease, and medical professionals as well as the recommendations of the ELCA and NC Synod.

And, to be absolutely clear, the Church is open. While CIC and congregations all over the world closed the doors of their sanctuaries months ago, the Church has continued to gather together in new and different ways in order to express our love for God and for our neighbors.

Loving God and loving our neighbors—this is the answer to another big question that is crucial for us to remember in all of this. Loving God and loving our neighbors is the reason *why* we gather together. Figuring out *how* and *when* we can do so physically in the same space in the future are crucial questions, but our *why* is not limited by space. We must not forget *why* we worship to begin with.

To say that we are eager to get back to in-person worship is a vast understatement. We miss regularly being with you in the ways we are used to <u>so much!</u> As we continue to eagerly anticipate that time when we can safely congregate, we are looking forward to the upcoming fellowship event on June 7th as well as numerous other ways for us to connect as the body of Christ. Whether it's through Zoom, Facebook, YouTube, e-mails, texts, or phone calls, whenever and however we gather together, Jesus is with us.

From the Church Council......

Hello CIC Members,

First topic: The annual meeting. After discernment among staff and council, along with consultation with the NC Synod office, we have unanimously decided to postpone the annual meeting. We will be planning on having our annual meeting in September but will remain flexible depending on the COVID-19 situation. Our annual meeting is both a starting-line and a finish-line for our congregation. It works as a venue to wrap up the previous year: report out on our finances, give thanks for the congregations generosity, celebrate our various ministries, and give thanks for our many lay leaders – including those rotating off of council. It also marks the beginning of a new year, where we elect new council members and adopt a new annual budget. All of these things will still happen during the September meeting! But – in the short term – we'll have to be nimble and adjust to this temporary reality as best as we can.

Second topic: Church council. CIC's council formed a nomination committee early this year to seek out interest and identify potential candidates to fill the council seats that were scheduled to be vacated by current members rolling off after three years of service. The committee was comprised of the two members ending their service, Pastor Lisa and Pastor Michael, Susan Kullstam, Carol Moser and Laverne Waskelis. The committee included an announcement in the bulletin and Tuesday emails weekly. Once the group had a list of candidates, each expressed a willingness to be considered for a position by Council and the congregation. Council voted in April to bring forth three candidates to be voted upon by the congregation at the Annual Meeting originally scheduled for May 31. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and state guidelines we now anticipate that the annual meeting will be held in September with nominees formally presented to the congregation at that time. As we all seek to maintain forward momentum with plans for CIC, Council voted to invite the proposed new council representatives to attend Council meetings starting in June in order to become oriented to processes and ongoing agenda items without yet having an official vote. The nominees for Council in 2020-2021 are Paul Handrock, Deborah Lowe and Paul Miller.

Last topic (for this month!): 2020-2021 budget. Lots of discernment, time, and debate has been put into our proposed 2020-2021 budget. While this is true every year, we are especially thankful for our strong financial leaders – Colleen, Thomas, Shari and entire finance team – and all the work they have done over the last few months. Council will be meeting on May 31st to finalize this tentative budget. Once finalized, we will begin operating against this tentative budget when our new fiscal year begins. When we reach the annual meeting in September, we will still present this budget to the congregation. If there are any changes, we will adopt those changes over the course of the remaining 2020 -2021 fiscal year. We are a pretty lean organization, like many churches, and our leaders and staff have been diligent about trimming or delaying every possible expense since the beginning of this COVID-19 crisis. We will remain diligent stewards of the congregation's financial gifts.





Celebration of Holy Communion

When and Where:

We will celebrate Holy Communion together on Sundays after the 10am livestream worship concludes. The communion portion of worship will take place via Zoom starting at 11am. The Zoom link will change each week. It is sent out each week in the weekly Take Two e-mail and a reminder in a Friday e-mail. If you haven't been receiving these e-mails, please contact Stephanie in the church office. (swheeler@communityinchrist.net)

Preparation:

- Setting: Please prepare a special space in your home to serve as the location where you will celebrate Holy Communion. Clear off a section of your table, desk, etc. where you can place a candle, a plate with bread, and a cup(s) with wine/grape juice.
- Supplies: You will need some type of bread and wine/grape juice. Unleavened bread is traditionally what is used. Only set out the amount of bread/wine/grape juice that you will consume.
- The recipe for CIC's communion bread is sent in the Friday e-mails.
- You are welcome to pick up bread, like pita, during your next grocery store purchase.
- Pre-packaged sealed wafer/juice packets (note, these are not gluten-free) are available at the church if you would like. Please contact the church office for a pick up time. You can pick up what you need for the month so that you don't have to pick up each week.

Participation:

- The communion liturgy looks similar to what occurs during a typical Sunday at CIC. One big difference is that when the elements are raised and blessed during the Words of Institution, you raise the bread and the wine in your home.
- After the Lord's Prayer, Pastor Lisa and Pastor Michael name participants one at a time and then we all commune together at the same time. After everyone has received communion, we conclude with a final prayer and blessing. You are on mute while you are not receiving communion.
- Non-communing children are welcome to receive a blessing.
