From the Pastor's Desk.....

Last May we as a congregation laid out our hopes for the future and from these hopes the council developed a five year strategic plan. The plan coincides with our mission to live like Jesus UP, IN and OUT. It includes five objectives: increase worship attendance to 500 (UP), become a tithing congregation (UP), increase participation in small groups to 50% (IN), Collect 2500 pounds of food for the hungry each year and help 10,000 people (OUT) and increase our racial diversity to match our local community (OUT/IN). In this column I want to talk about that last one.

Why do YOU want to increase our racial diversity? I ask the question that way, because these goals came from you the congregation, and wasn't something I anticipated although I welcome it. I'm sure your answers would be "diverse" as we all have different reasons for wanting that. I think it's a good goal for many reasons, one of which is evangelism-sharing the good news of Jesus.

We believe that the good news of Jesus is for all people and we are called to share it. When we become members of CIC we make a promise to proclaim the good news of Jesus in word and deed. If we are keeping that promise then we would naturally invite our whole community to faith in Christ and fellowship in this congregation. The logic goes that if we are successful at sharing the invitation equally then our congregation would look like our community.

The second reason is that God desires unity and equality. Jesus prayed for his church to be one in John 17. And in Galatians 3, Paul proclaimed that there is no longer Jew or Greek, male or female, slave or free but all are one in Christ. Pursuing racial diversity squares with what Jesus wants for his church. We are a diverse congregation, but not as diverse as our community. Why is that? How can we change that?

Those are the tough questions I want us to think about. This goal of diversity is an admiral one, it is also very difficult and fraught. Some people might even take offense at the goal itself. But having this goal has already pushed me to do some learning and growing in my understanding of race in America. And some looking in the mirror. This isn't the kind of goal you achieve by just making some minor adjustments. This is the kind of goal that calls us to uncomfortable places and learning. The kind of learning that challenges what we've always believed, the kind of learning that makes us look at our world through different eyes. I believe to achieve this goal the first thing we are going to have to do is to make some major efforts to grow in our understanding of race in our particular culture. I've started reading about race, right now I'm reading a very eye-opening book by Dr. Beverly Tatum titled Why are all the black kids sitting together in the cafeteria. Does the title itself make you uncomfortable, even defensive? Let's get used to that!

I want to learn and I'm willing to be uncomfortable as we pursue this goal. Will you come with me? I admit that I am a novice when it comes to talking about race. I know I will make missteps along the way, I will say things that are foolish and naïve. I expect to be wrong and unintentionally offend. I call that learning. Just like when I learned to ski, I fell down a lot, I made some mistakes getting on the chair lift, I dropped gloves and poles from the ski lift, I accidentally cut people off and even made others crash. But I didn't give up, I got better and now I'm pretty good at it.

I believe we can achieve this goal not because of our own effort, but because it is inspired of the Holy Spirit. I trust the Spirit to lead and guide us into this future and give us the courage to make the changes necessary. Yes, I said the word 'change.' That's what the Holy Spirit does in our lives, he changes us. May we all be changed this year as we seek God's will together.



Dominant Culture

Have you ever been in a situation where you were the minority? Maybe when you visited a foreign country and nobody spoke English. Or finding yourself in a community where you realized the color of your skin didn't match anybody else's. Then you've experienced what sociologists describe as Dominant and Subordinate culture. If you're part of the Dominant culture then you don't notice all the things that make you different. But if you're not part of the Dominant culture then you might feel like you 'stick out like sore thumb.' You become very aware of your inability to speak French or the different color of your skin.

Every culture has both dominant and subordinate parts. Every culture has a shared myth on what is normal. In America that myth might be that normal is white, male, heterosexual, thin, intelligent and financially secure. So, if you aren't one or more of these things, then you become very aware of it. But if you are all of these things then you likely don't think about it and wouldn't describe yourself in those terms.

Think about Jesus. In some ways, he was part of the dominant culture. He was male, Jewish, a rabbi(well educated), and healthy. But, he had great empathy for those who were part of the subordinate culture, he reached out to women and gentiles and the sick. And he challenged those who were like him, the Pharisees, to have similar empathy and love.

Understanding what the dominant culture is and examining where you line up or don't line up is the first step to having empathy for those whose experience in life is different than yours. -Pastor Travis


